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# Change Where Apps Install

Many computers these days are shipping with a combination of SSD and large capacity mechanical data drives or maybe you have multiple internal or external drives.

A great idea but it does require a bit more management, particularly when it comes to where to install new apps.

I most cases, you will want new apps installed on the data drive, not the smaller capacity solid-state boot drive (C)

To change the default drive for apps ...

Click Start – Settings – System - Storage



# Remove Windows.old

Hard Drive Storage is not as costly or as limited as it once was, but that doesn't mean you want to waste space if you don't have to.

If you upgraded to Windows 10 from Windows 7 or 8 you probably have a folder on your hard drive that contains the old version of Windows. On the assumption that you are never going to revert back to Windows 7 or 8, you can delete that folder and regain the storage space on your hard drive.

To delete the folder

**Open File Explorer** 

Navigate to the hard drive where Windows 10 resides (typically on "C") and Right-Click it.

Click the Properties menu item

Click the Disk Cleanup Button tp start the scan and then click the Clean Up System Files Button

# Add More Places To Send Files

When you are working in File Explorer and you right-click a file and navigate to the SEND TO menu item you'll see a small list of suggested places where you can send he file.

If you SHIFT+Right-Click that file instead and navigate to the SEND TO menu item you will be shown a much more extensive list of places where you can send that file

# Move Apps

If you discover that you are running out of space on a drive, you can try moving apps to another location via the Move Apps feature

Click the Notifications icon in he lower right corner of the default Windows 10 desktop

Click the All Settings button

Search "Apps & Features"

Click on the app you would like to move

# Move Apps

This tip is particularly useful for modern PC's that often come with 2 storage drives – a lower capacity SSD designated as the system drive and a higher capacity standard mechanical drive designated as the application drive.

The default installation drive for many applications is typically the system drive but in the double drive setup the second high capacity drive is the correct choice which means you will have to move apps from time to time. The New & Improved Clipboard The classic keyboard shortcut for

Copying is CTRL C Cutting is CTRL X Pasting is CTRL V

With the Windows Update v1903 the clipboard has been enhanced.

By default, Windows will now store every clipboard copy and cut in a history file and bring them back up in a box when you press the WINDOWS key + V

You can scroll through and click on one to paste it into your current document.

If you want to paste it again you can go back to

### Why would anyone want this?

I can only speak for myself. Most often I use it because I've copied something new before I had a chance to paste what I copied before. Or, I'e ben pasting the same thing over and over and copied something else in the middle of my task and then had to start over. Now I can paste it it again from history without going the long way around.

Another reason I use it is to refer to information I know I've copied before. Maybe it's an email address or some code sample. I could always find the source again, but it's quicker to bring up the Clipboard History and get it from there

# The New & Improved Clipboard

You can turn off this feature entirely

Windows can be told not to keep the history.

Open File Explorer and click the File Tab in the upper-left corner

Click the Change Folder and Search Options menu item

Click the down button in the Open File Explorer To box to see a list of possibilities

Let's take a look


The New X Improved **Snip & Sketch** Tool

The new Snip & Sketch Tool, which will eventually replace the old Windows Snipping Tool, includes a few extra features that help you to easily capture and annotate screenshots on your computer, and then save them or share them with others

There are many reasons why you might need to capture an image of your screen, but whatever the reason, the new snipping tool allows you to do exactly that and much more

The New Improved **Snip & Sketch** Tool

If you have never used the Snip & Sketch Tool you will likely get the original Snipping Tool to open as seen below



Click "Try Snip & Sketch"

To open in the future type snip in the Windows Search Bar

The New X Improved **Snip & Sketch** Tool

When you open the tool and create a new "snip" the new window will open with the snip and the option buttons on the top will come "alive" for editing or writing on captured images.

Hover your mouse pointer over all the buttons to see what they do.

It is very user friendly in that way.
