And, you're clueless or really don't understand about the cloud.

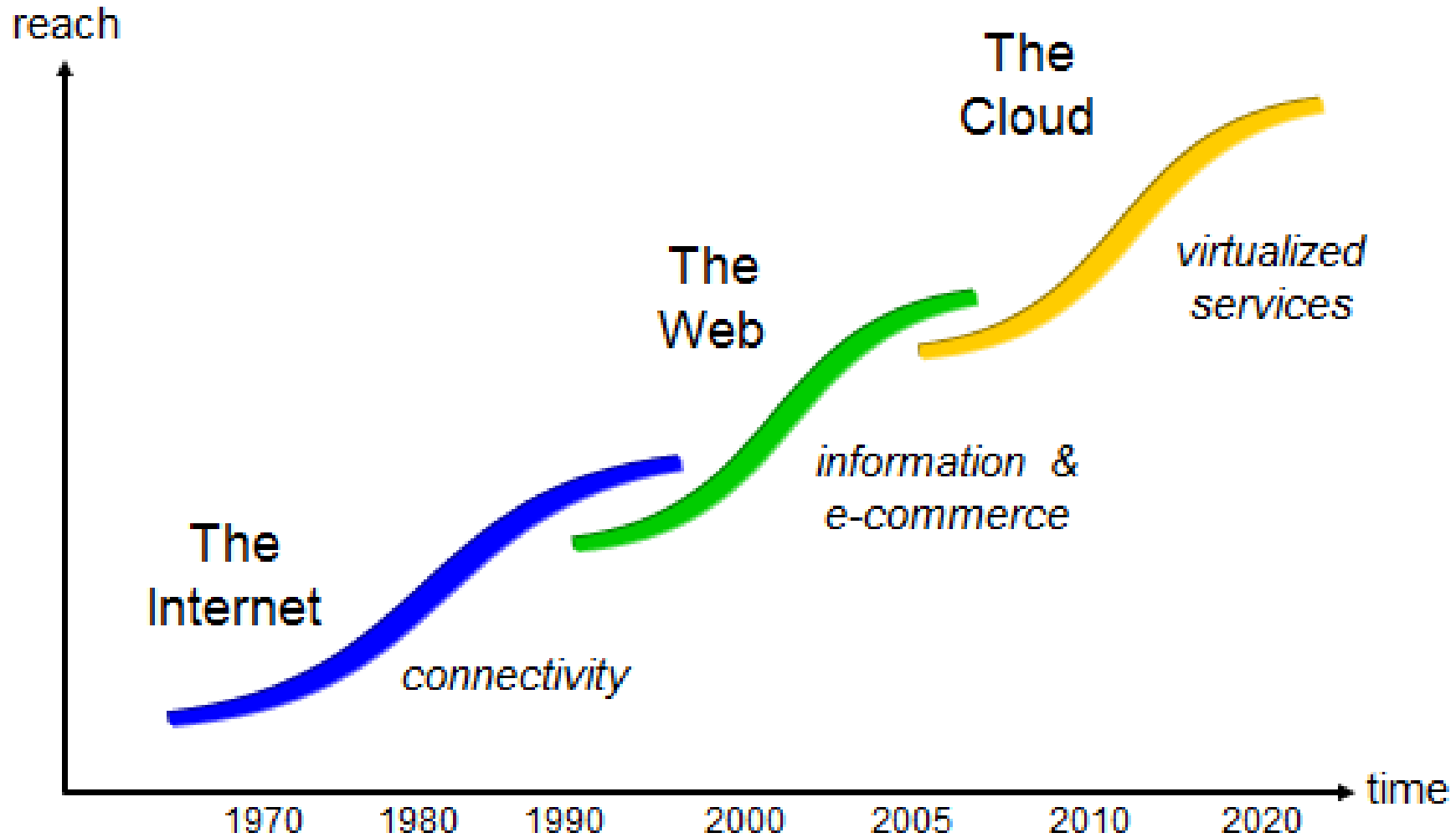
Cloud Confusion

One in five Americans (22 percent) admit that they've **pretended to know what the cloud is** or how it works.



When asked what “the cloud” is, a majority responded it’s either an actual cloud (specifically a “**fluffy white thing**”), the sky or something related to the weather (29 percent).
51% said stormy weather would interfere with their cloud computing

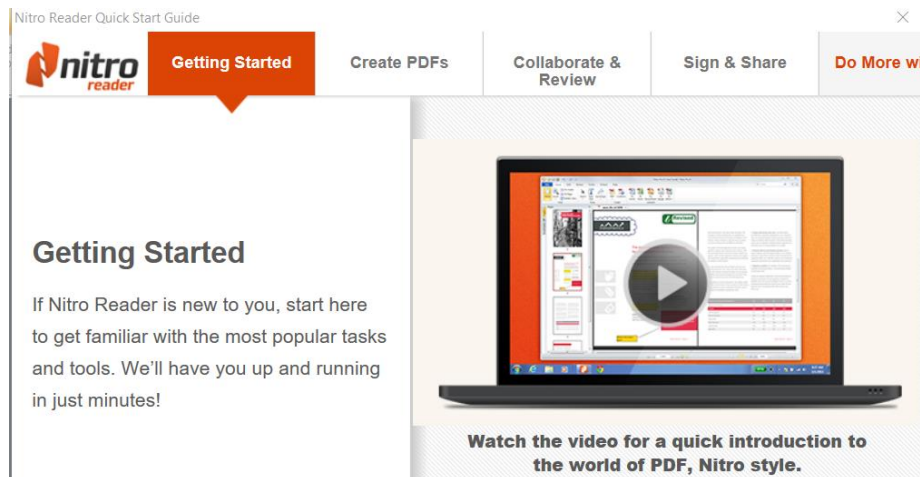


Your Computer Back-in-the-Day

What is the Cloud?

- It's everything we access remotely over the Internet
- Our data isn't actually in the sky in a white fluffy cloud
- When something is in the cloud, it means it's stored on a network of servers instead of (or in addition to) our computer's hard drive or external drive
- We access it via our favorite Web browser

- We can access our data from any device with an Internet connection

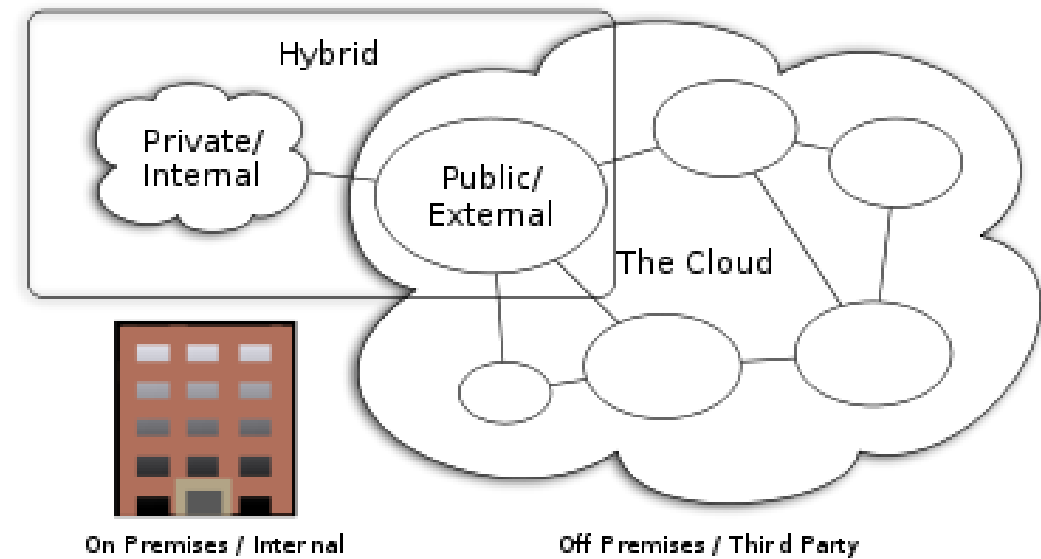

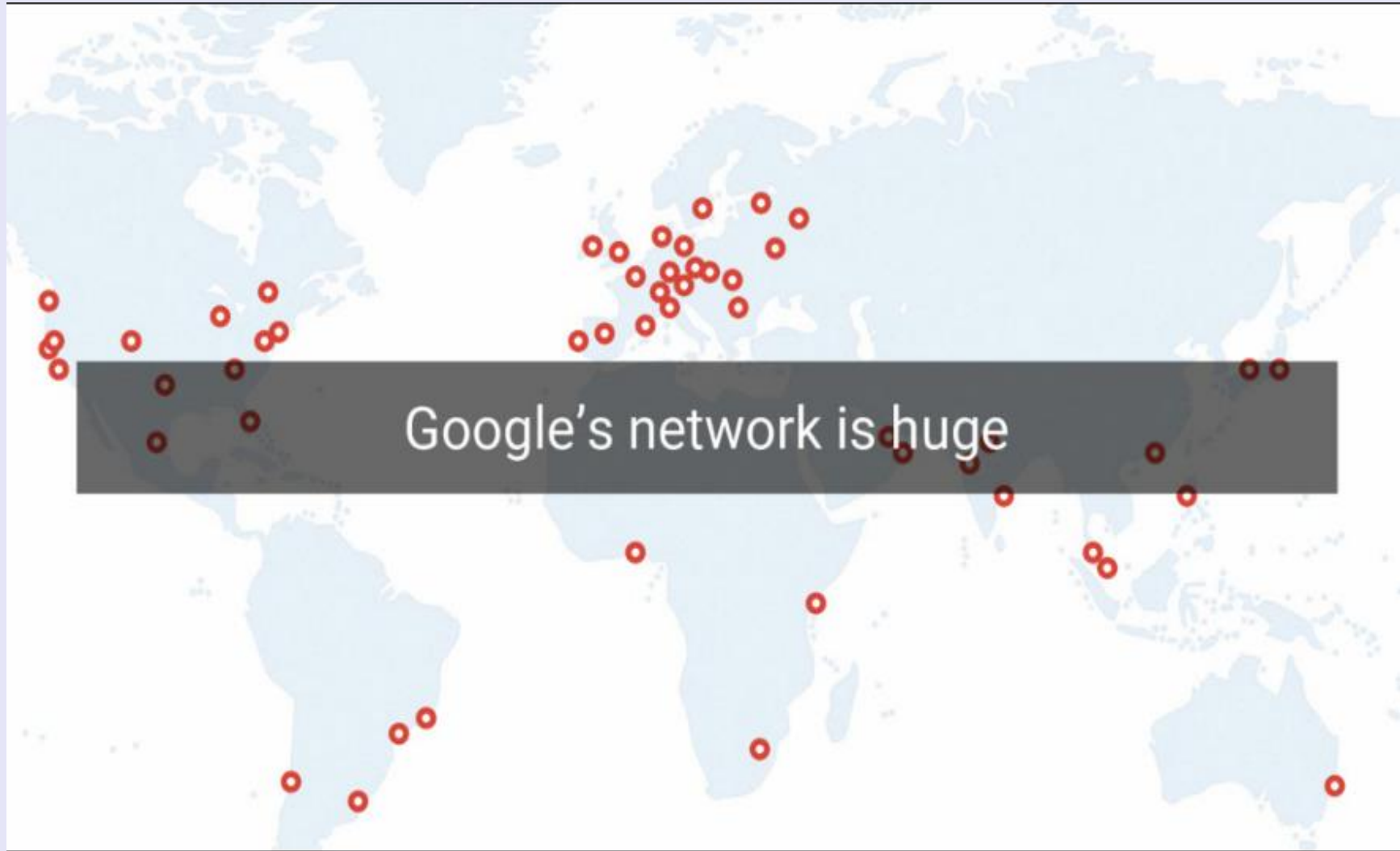
Where Does Everything Live?

- External HD stays at home

What is a Server?

- A server is a computer that provides data to other devices
- It processes requests and delivers data to our devices (computers, tablets, phones, etc.) over the Internet
- Server farm provides massive storage and processing power
- Rack-mountable hardware
- Takes up minimal space

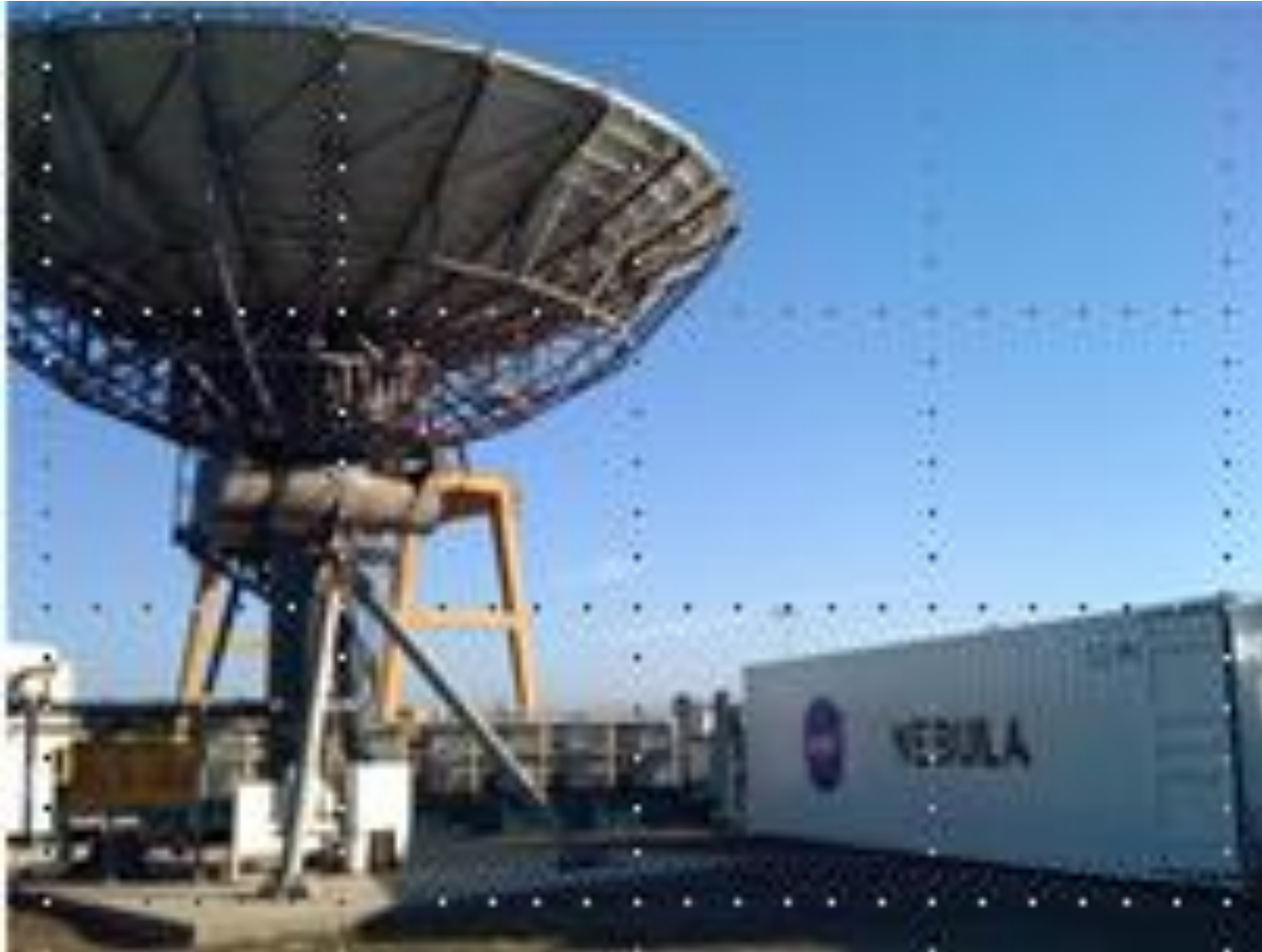


Facebook's Arctic Server



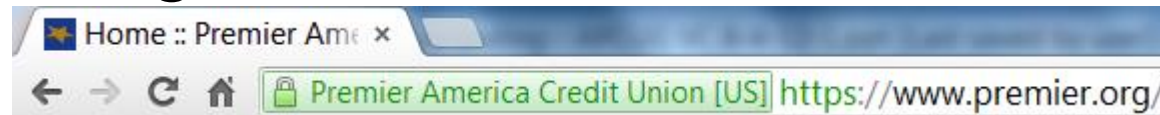

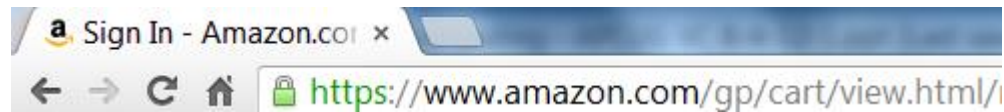
A majority of Americans (54 percent) claim to never use cloud computing. However, **95 percent of this group actually does use the cloud**

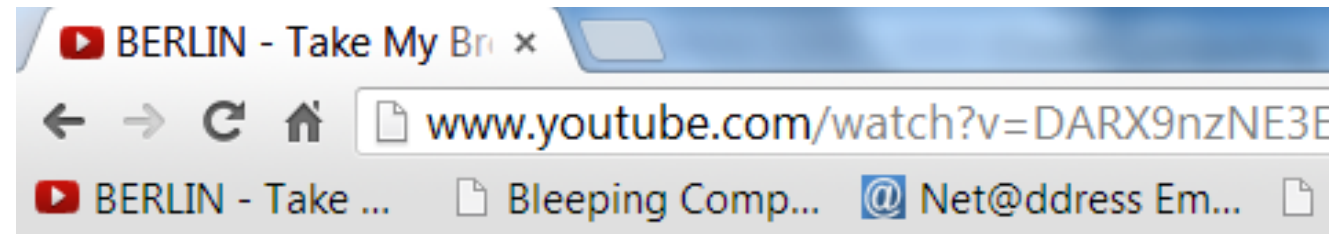

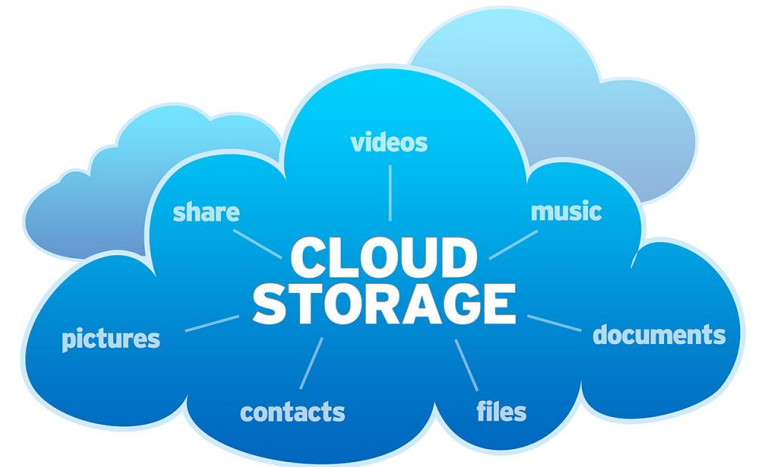

What is Storage in the Cloud?

- Redundant back-up of your important files/data/photos, etc.



iCloud

- Built into every new iOS device and Mac
- Access music, photos, calendars, contacts, documents, and more



Android Google

- Built into every Android phone, Chromebook, etc.
- Access through your Gmail account
- Music, photos, calendars, contacts, documents, and more



Chromebooks

- Are all about the cloud
- Designed primarily to use when connected to the Internet
- Google's Chrome OS
- Don't need security software
- Automatically checks for and applies security updates

Chromebooks

- Use Google Docs
- Can access them directly from Chromebook
- Can work off-line and save to USB drive
- School districts buying Chromebooks for students and staff

Backup / Storage in the Cloud

- External Hard Drive
- DVDs
- Redundant = Cloud
- Data stored in multiple locations
 - Protected – Password
 - Encrypted
 - Access anywhere / anytime
- Latest version v. many versions
- Free v. Paid

Backup / Storage in the Cloud

FREE

- Microsoft OneDrive (PC/Mac/Android and iOS device) – 5GB
- OneDrive – 15GB
- Office 365 - Unlimited
- Google Drive – 15GB
- Google Photos – Unlimited
- iCloud – 5GB

Backup / Storage in the Cloud

FREE

- Amazon Prime – 5GB
- Amazon Prime Photos – Unlimited
- Dropbox – 2GB
- iDrive – 5GB

Backup / Storage in the Cloud

PAY

- Microsoft OneDrive - 100GB \$2/month
- Google Drive – 100GB \$2/month
- Amazon Prime – 1TB \$60/year
- iCloud – 50GB - \$1/month
- Dropbox – 100GB \$10/month
- IDrive – 2TB \$52/year

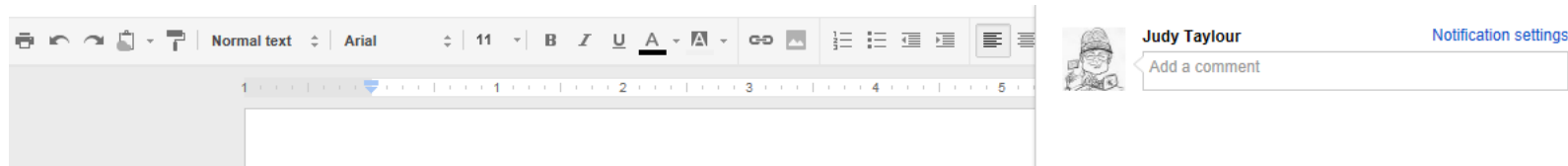
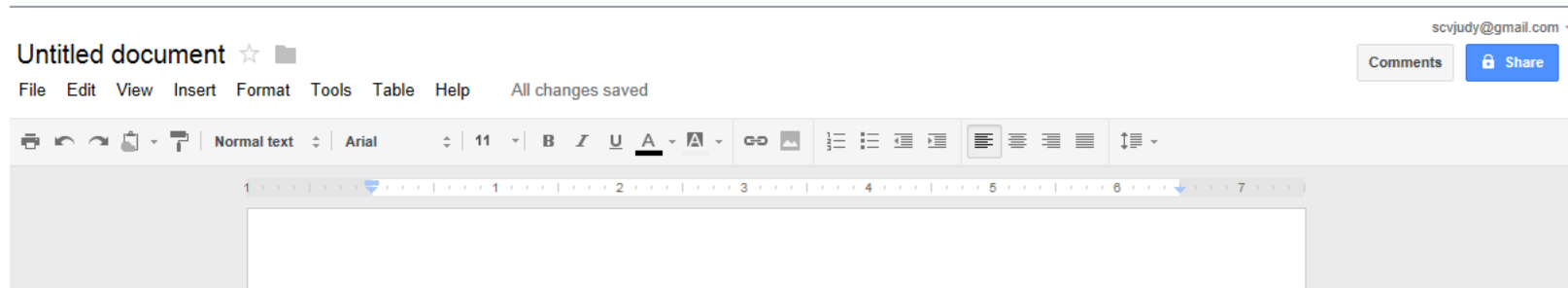
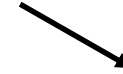
Using Google in the Cloud

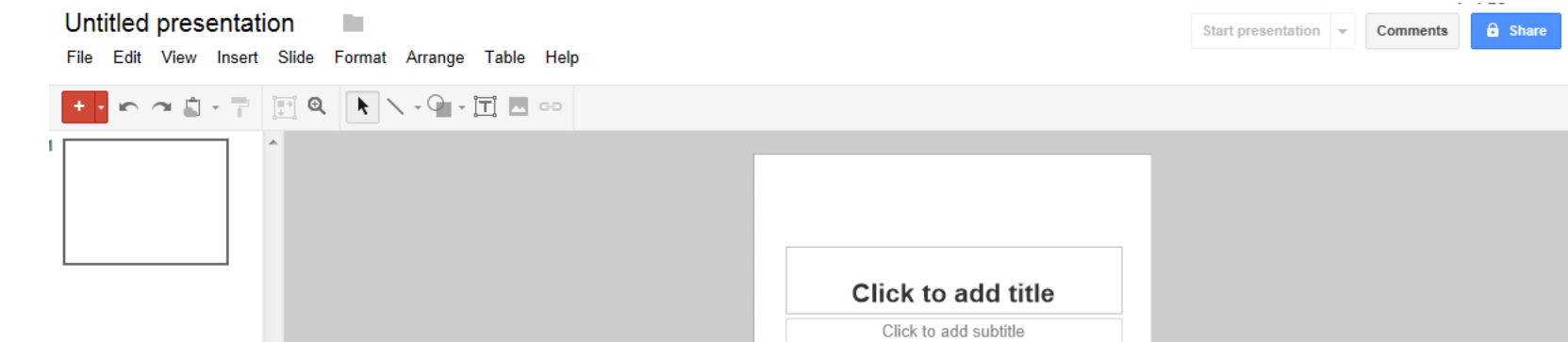
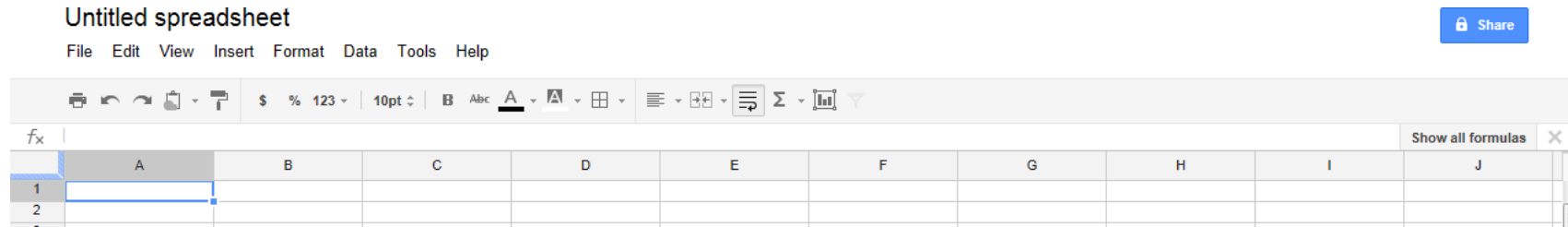

The Internet of Things

- Is all about the Cloud
- According to analysis firm Gartner, the number of IoT devices will be 20.8B by 2020
- 2.5 IoT devices per person on the planet
- Probably too much data from IoT devices for existing cloud
- IoT designers and cloud programmers working together

The Internet of Things

- New way of analyzing IoT data being worked on
- Can mitigate dependency on cloud storage and enhance IoT role in performing computations and making decisions while staying close to end-user.
- Each IoT device needs own password
- Install updates in timely manner (think Microsoft Tuesday updates)
